## What to Do:

Design a flag that shows School Zone Safety.

Think about crosswalks, slowing down, paying attention, walking, biking, or helping others.

Use bold colors and simple shapes so it can be seen from far away.

## Guidelines:

- Students in grades K-5 may submit
- Artwork must reflect innovative ideas that promote walking and biking.
- Submissions must be original and created specifically for this competition.
- Must fit in the attached flag template
- Each submission should include a brief written description of the idea behind the art (50-200 words).

## Judging Criteria:

- Creativity and originality (no AI submissions)
- Relevance to the theme
- Presentation and effort
- Potential impact of the vision on community health and sustainability

## Winner

Your design becomes the official SRTS Regional Flag for next school year!

Your flag will be used at Walk & Roll to School Days and safety events.

We will also print yard signs of your art for placing in school zones.

## Runners-Up

Your design will be featured on our website. You will get cool safety prizes like bike lights or reflective swag.
