

Locally Coordinated Plans


FBRMPO is updating its Locally Coordinated Public Transit–Human Services Transportation Plan (LCP) to better reflect current community needs. The update evaluates existing services, identifies unmet transportation needs for older adults, people with disabilities, and low-income residents, and sets priorities for future investments. This work will guide competitive funding decisions, strengthen coordination among providers, and ensure the region's transportation system remains equitable, accessible, and responsive to growth and change across the French Broad River MPO planning area. The update is currently underway and is expected to be completed in early 2027; be on the lookout for surveys and public input opportunities.

Draft UPWP

The Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) outlines the French Broad River MPO's annual planning efforts and budget. It describes what transportation planning activities the MPO and its partners will undertake during that fiscal year. The UPWP also outlines how those activities will support federal and regional goals and how federal, state, and local planning funds will be used. The FY 2027 UPWP includes prep work for the next MTP, safety planning, and multiple special studies. The FY 2027 UPWP also focuses on maintaining the TIP, Prioritization 8.0, updating the Locally Coordinated Plan, and key strategic and organizational planning. The 2026 call for NC Bike Helmet Initiative is open until Feb 20th. This annual opportunity aims to reduce child/youth bicycle fatalities and serious injuries, including head trauma, in North Carolina. Applicants have the option of requesting up to 100 helmets. 
LOS Safe Routes to School

Hazelwood Sidewalks

Sidewalk improvements along Hazelwood Avenue in Waynesville are a strong example of how the prioritization process translates planning into real community benefits. Funded through a partnership between the MPO, the Town of Waynesville, and North Carolina Department of Transportation, the project created safer walking connections to Hazelwood Elementary School and nearby neighborhoods. Though constructed back in 2016, the sidewalks continue to support daily travel, student safety, and long-term community connectivity. The P8 prioritization process is currently underway with the hopes of providing more investments in safe infrastructure.

Safety Targets

The MPO Board adopted updated annual safety performance targets consistent with the MPO's Safety Action Plan, which sets a long-term goal of reducing serious and fatal injuries by 10% by 2035. While recent data show an upward trend in severe crashes, the Board chose targets that remain counter to this trend but are grounded in local conditions and observed patterns. These targets differ from the State's more aggressive benchmarks and reflect a commitment to setting realistic, data-informed goals that support steady and measurable progress in improving transportation safety.


